Lessons in Faith

God is **Supernatural**. He works things in an unnatural manner to show forth His **glory**. Since He cannot be seen, He absolutely must be **believed** to work for us. Believing is a "work" that He has given us to do. (St. John 6:29) God sent His Son, Jesus Christ, into the world through the womb of the virgin Mary. The birth was by His **Will**. God's Will is always going to be done on earth. (Ephesians 1:11)

Mary was a virgin; she became a mother without the aid of a man. This was humanly impossible. Being a virgin was the perfect situation for God to work and show forth His glory. The impregnation was accomplished solely by the Holy Spirit. Several lessons can be learned about exercising <u>Faith</u> from Mary's experience because she received exactly what God said.

Lesson 1: God gives us *Thoughts* in words from Him before He "works" the *things* that He has prepared for us. His Thoughts generate an "expectation" in our heart for the things. The Angel Gabriel came to Mary with a "Promise Thought" from God. She did not know how it would happen nor what it would be like. Mary only knew about child birth between a man and women. Note carefully, all Mary had was a thought sent from God. He had decided that she would bear His Son. (Isaiah 14:24) She had to: (1) clearly understand the word that the Angel spoke, (2) accept the word as true and (3) begin to expect the thing to happen.

Lesson 2: The Angel told Mary that she was two important things: (1) blessed and (2) highly favored. (St. Luke 1:28) By Faith in Christ, we, too, are blessed as the Seed of Abraham. (Galatians 3:9) We are also highly favored. We

Were created inside Christ unto **good** works. (*Ephesians 2:10*) By performing those works, we "obtain" favor from God. (*Proverbs 11:27*) (*Proverbs 12:2*) Through favor, God uses <u>people</u> and <u>circumstances</u> to bless our lives in ways the we do not expect, nor could we make happen ourselves, just like Mary.

Lesson 3: Our Mind is key to receiving from God. It must be changed from <u>natural</u> to <u>spiritual</u> to receive. (Romans 12:2) Reason: the natural Mind "does not" receive the knowledge of God thus causing us to miss our rightful blessings. A "spiritual thought" from God does not <u>fit</u> into a "natural mind." The natural, or carnal, mind is tied to the natural world and "opposes" God. Spiritual knowledge is **foolishness** to it. (I Corinthians 2:14)

Lesson 4: There must be <u>agreement</u> with God for His Power to work. Mary had to <u>agree</u> with the Angel, not reject His words. Agreement dictates that we no longer "look" at our present situation. Mary had to now **think** that what the Angel said was <u>true</u> and was <u>coming</u> to pass. (St. Luke 1:38) A critical part of the work of the Holy Spirit is to show us "things" to **come**. '(St. John 16:13) Exercising Faith is thinking accordingly as follows:

- Possession Thinking—We must think and confess that we have what God has in His glory for us. (St. Mark 11:23) If we have the thought, we have the thing in spirit form.
- Expectant Thinking—Daily, we "look forward," not at our present situation. We expect to see manifestations of God's glory. Every Promise of God "binds" Him to specific performance on our behalf. Our thinking only on His Promises is expectant thinking. (Psalm 62:5)
